



Projected population change 2014-2050 in per cent






## Older population of 60 years and more 2014



#### Younger population of less than 25 years 2014





Foreign born in per cent of total population






## Net-migration 2010-2015




## Net-migration 2010-2015

Immigration minus emigration per 1 000 habitants






















